NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The City of Strafford is planning on implementing a new communication tool to get information out to our Utility customers quickly. We will have the capability to notify you by email or text message important notices of events or issues that may affect you as they occur.

In order to be included in this notification system, you will need to provide us with either an email address, cell phone number or both. You can do that by calling Terri at City Hall (417) 736-2174, emailing her at clerk@straffordmo.net, leaving it in the night drop at City Hall, or dropping by to see us.

The system will be available for all citizens with a utility account and should be available within the next couple months. If there are any issues with the water system such as boil orders or temporary shut downs of service, we will be able to quickly advise you of those situations. We may occasionally notify you of other events within the City that may affect you or be of interest to you.

Get your information to us as soon as possible so you are on the notification list!



Week of April 15th—21st: Bring limbs to the curb—Prepare shrubbery & tree limbs (**NO LARGER THAN 3"**) and bring to curb.

Week of April 22nd—April 26th: Pick up and chipping—Public Works will come through town, **one time** and chip the debris you have placed by the curb. Limbs must be under 3" and be at the curb April 22nd or they will **NOT** be picked up.

MAY 4th— CITY WIDE GARAGE SALE—

Please notify City Hall by May 2nd if you would like to be put on the list of sales being held that day. We will print the list— available for pick up, and posted on the website by May 2nd. No permit is required for sales being held this weekend.

Dog Licenses—All dogs within the city limits must be vaccinated for rabies . It is also required that all dogs be licensed through the City annually. Licenses are due for renewal on December 1st and are \$10.00 per year (\$5.00 if the dog is spayed or neutered.)

Building Permits—A Building Permit must be obtained prior to any new construction or remodeling. It is also a requirement to obtain a permit prior to setting a portable building, re-roofing, or adding a deck. Permits are available at City Hall. Please call City Hall for more information.
